ANNUAL PLAN OF OPERATIONS 2021-2022

Brief History, Past Performance And Abstract of APO 2021-22

TELANGANA CAMPA

(COMPENSATORY AFFORESTATION FUND MANAGEMENT AND PLANNING AUTHORITY)

Part-1 of Annual Plan of Operation

(a) Brief description of Forest in the Telangana State

- (i) Telangana is the 12th largest state in India, geographical area wise; with an area of 112101 km². It is bounded by Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and Odisha in the north, Andhra Pradesh in the east, Andhra Pradesh and Tamilnadu in the south and Karnataka & Maharashtra in the west. The state was formed on 2nd June, 2014 by Government of India as 29th State. The State has been reorganised into 31 districts from ten districts on 11.10.2016 and into 33 districts from 2019.
- (ii) It has 26969.49km² of notified forest land, which is 24.05% of the Geographical area. Bhadradri-Kothagudem District has highest forest area of 4311.43 km² which is 60.95% to the Geographical area of the district, followed by Mulugu District with2939.16 km². The Mulugu District has 71.81% of forest area with respect to geographical area, which is highest. Karimnagar has lowest forest area of 4.88 km² including CA area of 1.41 km² which is 0.23% to the Geographical area of the district.
- (iii) The forest cover (areas having vegetation cover of > 0.1 canopy density) in Telangana is 16666.74 km² (286.48 km² of Very Dense Forest, 7896.00 km² of Moderately Dense Forest and 8484.26 km² of Open Forest) which is 14.86% of the Geographical area (112101 km²). The area of the Scrub is 4419.70km², Non-Forest 5726.39km² and Water Bodies 156.65km².
- (iv) The State has 12 Protected Areas (PA) 3 National Parks&9 Wildlife Sanctuaries. Later, two Tiger Reserves viz., Amarabad Tiger Reserve (ATR), having the distinction of being the largest Tiger Reserve of India and Kawal Tiger Reserve were notified. Out of 26903.70 km² of notified forest area, 5856.04 km² is included in the PA network, covering an area of about 21.77% of the notified forests and 5.22% of Geographical area of the State.
- (v) As per the Champion and Seth Classification, the major forest types include Southern Tropical Dry Deciduous Forests (5A/C3 Type) (Tectona, Chloroxylon, Lagerstroemia, Hardwickia, Anogeissus, Terminalia, Xylia, Mitragyna, Cleistanthus) and Dry Deciduous Scrub Forests (5DS1 Type) (Acacia leucophloea, Canthium, Randia, Cassia fistula, Gardenia, Albizzia Amara, Dodonaea). The state is bestowed with dense Teak forest along river Godavari.
- (vi) As regards the trees outside notified forests, extent of tree cover under various classes is 6957.22 km², which comes to 6.21% of the geographical area. The natural forests, plantations & habitations constitute 33.42%, 28.50% and 38.08% of the total ToF Area respectively.

- (vii) State is endowed with rich diversity of Flora and Fauna: Floral diversity - 535 Tree species, 245 Shrubs, 300 Climbers, 1565 Herbs, 294 Grass species; Faunal Diversity - 103 Mammal species, 365 Bird Species, 78 Reptile species, 21 Amphibian species. Important Endangered species found in the state are: Tiger, Panther, Gaur, Four Horned Antelope, Black Buck & Marsh Crocodile.
- (viii) The population of the state is 35.19 million (2011 census) which is 3.08 % of country's population. Nearly 61.3% of the population of the state is rural, which primarily depend on agriculture for livelihoods. Scheduled castes constitute about 7.75% and Scheduled tribes about 9.34% of the population.

Steering Committee noted the information with respect to entrustment and progress of study of Biodiversity at proposed Urban Parks & Kaleshwaram CA Project Areas to Prof, Jaya Shankar Agricultural University, Rajendranagar.

B. Agenda-V: Approval of Expenditure incurred towards Strike Force, Check posts for (4) months i.e. from April,2019 to July,2019 during the year 2019-20 under CAMPA

Noted the information.

C. Agenda-VI: Approval of Annual Plan of Operations for the year 2020-21 under CAMPA:

Steering Committee noted the information with respect to approval of Rs.48378.00 lakhs by the Executive Committee of National CAMPA authority

against Rs.60300.00 lakhs Annual Plan of operations proposed by the state steering committee for the year 2020-21. An amount of Rs.119.220 Crores was not agreed by the National Authority and out of that, an amount of Rs. 23.00 crores towards Mobility charges, Human & wild life conflict, Data uploading charges etc. was tagged under State Plan Afforestation Scheme.

Further, an amount of Rs. 92.79 crores meant for construction of protection structures for urban forest areas was not approved by the Executive Committee of National CAMPA Authority. The proposals were resubmitted to the National CAMPA Authority for approval vide PCCF,TS,Hyd Rc. No. 18595/2019/CAMPA, Dt.20.11.2020 duly putting the activity under Assisted Natural Regeneration as permissible under Rule 5(2) (a) of the CAF Rules 2018 as suggested by the Director General Forests & Special Secretary to Government, GOI, New Delhi & Chairperson National Executive Committee. It was also informed that above activity was already approved in earlier years.

However, in the 9th Executive Committee of the National CAMPA authority held on 12.01.2021, the proposals were discussed and it was informed that "The EC did not agree to the proposal of the PCCF(HoFF), Government of Telangana received vide her letter no. 18595/CAMPA/2019 dated 20.11.2021 regarding construction of high cost protection structures in forest blocks and urban forest blocks at a cost of Rs. 87.82 crore and at Medchal-Yadgarpally RF-I & II at a cost of Rs. 4.97 crore. The PCCF(HoFF) justified the proposed structures, especially in urban forest blocks, which are vulnerable to encroachments due to high cost of land. The EC noted that this may be a common problem in many states/UTs and felt the need to formulate a new scheme for the protection of such forest land from the National Fund. The state was advised to resubmit the proposal thereafter to the National Authority for consideration."

Rule 5(2)(d) of the Compensatory Afforestation Fund (CAF) Rules 2018, provides for "Protection of Plantation & Forests" as permissible activities under 80% of Net Present Value (NPV). Protection structures such as Chain-link fencing, See Through wall etc. have been approved by the National CAMPA during the year 2018-19 (Rs.2700.00 lakhs) and 2019-20 (Rs.11401.079 lakhs

including spill over) in the urban forest blocks as well as for RF blocks vide IGF&CEO, National CAMPA No.15-2(38)/2016-CAMPA,Dt.23.08.2018 & IGF(Su) cum Jt.CEO, National CAMPA F.NNo.11-100/2015-Fc(pt),Dt.21.06.2019.

During the year 2020-21, the proposals for the Protection Structures like Chain-link Fencing, See Through Wall etc. for Rs. 87.82 crs (Rs.63.96 crs spillover works of 2019-20 and Rs. 23.86 crs fresh work of 2020-21) under NPV and Rs. 4.97 crs under interest component which are permissible activities as per the provisions of the CAF Rules 2018 were proposed and all the works are already grounded and are at different stages of completion.

In view of the circumstances explained, the Steering Committee has again resolved to approve the proposals for construction of protection structures for Rs.92.79 lakhs including spill over which are permissible under 80% NPV of the Rule 5(2)(a) or Rule 5(2)(d) and Rule 6(a)(vi) of the CAF Rules 2018 and to send another letter to National CAMPA Executive Committee and Governing Body for approval/ratification.

D. <u>Preparation of Supplementary proposals for another 900.00 Crores</u> for Rejuvenation of Forest Development of Urban Forest:

Steering Committee noted the information with respect to preparation of Forest Rejuvenation Action Plan for all RF Blocks in the state with scientific inputs and identifying forestry activities after extensive field exercise as required for rejuvenation of forests in the state for achieving different national and global commitments and could be utilized for achieving different indicators of Sustainable Development Goals. The Committee appreciated the efforts made as this information could be used for preparation of Annual Plan of Operation of CAMPA in a systemic manner in coming years.

- (b) After National bidding of Request for Proposal (RFP) as prepared by IIFM, Bhopal, the third party evaluation of CAMPA works from 2009-10

to 2015-16 year wise, were entrusted to M/S IORA Ecological Solutions Limited, New Delhi during 2017-18. The Evaluation reports were approved by the state Executive & Steering committee and were submitted to the Ad-hoc CAMPA along with the proposal for APO 2018-19 vide PCCF Rc. No. 5603/2017/CAMPA, Dt. 27.06.2018.

As per RFP, 10% of all CAMPA activities (component/sub-component wise) were evaluated and scoring were given for quantitative and qualitative parameters .Based on the percent of total score obtained by different CAMPA activities, performance for the year 2009-10 was Highly Satisfactory, for the year 2011-12 & 2012-13 were Satisfactory and for the years, 2010-11, 2013-14, 2014-15 & 2015-16 were Moderately Satisfactory .

(c) National bidding for Third Party Evaluation of CAMPA works for the years 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19 has been entrusted to M/S IORA Ecological Solutions Limited, New Delhi in March 2021 and it will be completed in due course.
