#### Brief history & Past Performance

#### a) Brief description of Forest and Forestry Sector in the State.

**Location:**Mizoram is located in the North Eastern corner of India and shares its boundaries with Assam, Manipur and Tripura and has very long international borders with Bangladesh and Myanmar. The total geographic area of the State is 21,081 sq.km, and lies between 21°56' N to 24°31' N latitude and 92°16' E to 93°26' E longitude.

**Forest Resources:** Forests have been the most important natural resources to the people as 85.34 per cent of the geographical area of the State is under forest and tree cover (ISFR, 2023).

**Forestry Sector:** When Mizoram became Union Territory in 1972, the State Forest Department was also established headed by Director of Forests as head of Department. Initially, the whole of Mizoram was divided into only two territorial Forest Divisions namely Aizawl Forest Division and Lunglei Forest Division. The head of the Department (Director of Forests) was then re-named as Chief Conservator of Forests with the creation of new post of Chief Conservator of Forests in 1983.

#### f) Brief description and abstract of the monitoring work done by the Monitoring and Evaluation Wing of the State Forest Department.

Since there is no separate Monitoring and Evaluation wing under Mizoram Forest Department, Senior Forest Officers such as CF and above conducted monitoring activities as and when required and necessary action/directions were given to the implementing Divisions based on performance.



## g) Brief description and abstract of the monitoring work done by the independent monitor (Third Party Monitoring) in the State.

The State Forests Department has been undertaking various works viz. Compensatory Afforestation (CA) and Non-Compensatory Afforestation (Plantation works other than CA) works with funds provided under APOs of 2009-20 till 2023-24 of State CAMPA *in lieu* of forest land diverted in respect of various FCA Projects.

The State Forest Department had engaged Independent Monitoring Agency viz. Save Environment Association (SENVA) to carry out Monitoring and Evaluation of works under CAMPA APO (part of APO 20202-1 & APO 2021-22) and the report had been submitted vide No.B.20018/23(A)/2021-CAMPA/PCCF dt.3.3.2025 to the Ministry. Invitation for Expression of Interest for APO 2022-23, 2023-24 & 2024-25 is under process.

In addition, the State Forests Department conducts Internal monitoring and evaluation of various CA and non-CA works undertaken in various territorial Forest Divisions from time to time.

#### (h) Any other important information for consideration relevant for preparing APO

The Principal Amount (Total amount accumulated in the State CAMPA account) is Rs. 199.48 crore (Rupees one hundred ninety nine crore forty eight lakh) approx. CAMPA consists of 6 component such as CA, CATP, IWMP, NPV, Interest and Other.

As per the decision taken in the Executive Committee in the National Authority, the NPV component has been rationalized to not more than 20% of the Principal Amount. Since the Principal amount for NPV is Rs. 153.89 crore (approx) thus, the (20%) amounts is Rs. 30.78 crore (approx). CA, CATP, IWMP & Other component are mandatory activities and the limit cannot be fixed.

For APO 2025-26, under CA component, Rs. 0.55 crore is proposed. Under NPV component, Rs. 2.31 crore is proposed, under Interest component, Rs. 1.00 crore is proposed for phase-I of the APO which is already approved by the EC of NA.

In addition to APO Phase-I, Rs 17.42 cr proposal is now submitted under NPV component for phase-II of the APO 2025-26 alongwith Five Year Perspective Plan.

## EXPLANATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS NOTIFICATION

- UN-SKILLED WORK: means work which involves simple operation, little or no skill or experience in the job.
- SEMI-SKILLED: means work which involves some degree of skill of competence acquired through experience on the job which is capable of being performed under the supervision and guidance of skilled employees and includes unskilled supervisory work.
- 3. SKILLED-II (IUNIOR GRADE): means work which involves skills or competence acquired through experience on jobs or through training as apprentice in a technical or vocational institute and the performance of which calls for initiative and judgement.
- SKILLED I (SENIOR GRADE): Means experience in the work requiring great skills.
- 5. WORKING PERIOD: The number of working hours per day will normally be 8 hours approximately for technical works and the number of working hours like clerical, peons etc per day will be as prescribed by the employers. Workers who are engaged in offices will follow the office hours of the Office/Department where they are employed.
- 6. PAID HOLIDAYS: Workers other than clerical, peon etc working in the office will enjoy the following paid holidays in addition to the Sunday benefit as enjoyed by the workers provided they work continuously for 6(six) days a week-

# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF STEERING COMMITTEE OF STATE AUTHORITY (CAMPA) HELD ON 13.08.2025 at 1430 Hrs IN THE SAD CONFERENCE HALL, MINECO, AIZAWL

The 9<sup>th</sup> meeting of Steering Committee of State Authority (CAMPA) was held on 13.08.2025 at 1430 Hrs in the SAD Conference Hall, MINECO, Aizawl to examine and finalize the draft Annual Plan of Operation (APO) of CAMPA for the year 2025-26 Phase-II (NPV Component). The draft APO was earlier discussed in the meeting of Executive Committee held on 11.07.2025 under the chairmanship of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests.

A list of participants who attended the meeting is appended as Annexure-I.

The Chairman, welcomed the participating members of the Steering Committee and after a brief round of introduction of all members; he invited the CEO CAMPA & Member Secretary to present the agenda of the meeting.

The CEO, CAMPA, made a detailed presentation on various agenda items, including the proposals for Phase-II (NPV Component) under the CAMPA APO 2025–26. This was followed by detailed agenda-wise deliberations, based on which the following decisions were taken:

## Agenda-I: Confirmation of minutes of 1st Steering Committee Meeting held on 17.4.2025

The 8th meeting of Steering Committee of State Authority (CAMPA) was held on 17.04.2025 in the Chief Secretary's Conference Hall, MINECO, Aizawl in which the APO for Phase-I, amounting to ₹ 3.86 crore, included only the mandatory plantation activities of Compensatory Afforestation (CA) along with other committed and ongoing expenses, as per relevant rules and guidelines. The phase-I also proposed revalidating the approval for the spill over works of the APO 2024-25, amounting to ₹ 16.59 crore.

**Decision** - As no comments have been received from any member and also the above proposal of the Steering Committee has been approved by Executive Committee of National Authority in its 34<sup>th</sup> & 35<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 23.4.2025 and 4.7.2025 respectively, the minutes of committee meeting held on 17.4.2025 was confirmed.

## Agenda – II: Progress Review of the 1st Quarter (April 2025 – June 2025)

The activities which were implemented during the first quarter of the FY 2025-26 were part of the CAMPA APO 2024-25, for which the funds were released in February 2025. Since the planting season was already over at that time, activities could not be taken up during last year. The funds & works have been now been revalidated by the National CAMPA and hence plantation activities were undertaken in the 1st Quarter of 2025-26 (April-June 2025).

#### Agenda III: Status of Audit of CAMPA Account

The CAMPA Audit by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India has been completed for the period from 2019-20 to 2022-23 and the State Finance Audit Report till the year ending 31.03.2023 submitted.

The compliance audit of the accounts of the PCCF Office for the period from 01/04/2022 to 31/03/2025 was conducted by a team led by the Senior Audit Officer (I/O) from the office of the Principal Accountant General (PAG), Mizoram. The audit also included the compliance audit of CAMPA accounts for the same period. The report is received recently and is under perusal of the department.

**Decision** – Committee expressed satisfaction on the progress reported.

#### Agenda IV: Status of 3rd Party Monitoring & Evaluation of CAMPA Works

The Third-Party Monitoring for CAMPA APO period 2020-21 and 2021-22 was completed by Save Environment Association (SENVA), Mizoram and the Monitoring reports have been submitted up to the year 2021-22. The overall grading awarded in the report was 7.5 out of 10, falling under the "Very Good" category. The highlights of the report was placed before the Committee for its information.

For subsequent years, although the draft Expression of Interest (EoI) was approved for two years 2022-23 & 2023-24, however the proposal was resubmitted in compliance with the guidelines received from National CAMPA, vide its letter dated 31.1.2025, wherein emphasis was laid on the need to, invite proposals for the Monitoring and Evaluation works from premier institutes like ICFRE, IIFM, NEERI etc. and other agencies which are working independently; these should not include the local NGOs/organizations which are attached /working with the forest department. Accordingly, the proposal for approval of draft Expression of Interest (EoI) for inviting bids is currently resubmitted to the Administration Department for approval after including one more APO year, to compensate for the delay.

**Decision** – Committee expressed satisfaction on the progress reported.



#### Agenda V: CAMPA APO 2025-26 phase II (NPV Component) with 5 year perspective Plan.

The CEO (CAMPA) explained that the APO-2025-26 has been submitted in two phases, as the National CAMPA has mandated the submission of a five-year perspective plan of the Net Present Value (NPV) component, the preparation of which required detailed planning and discussions with Divisions and Circle heads. The already approved APO 2025-26 Phase-I, amounting to ₹3.86 crore, included only the mandatory plantation activities including Compensatory Afforestation (CA) activities along with other committed and ongoing expenses, as per relevant rules and guidelines.

The Phase II of the APO 2025-26 has been prepared along with the Five-Year Perspective Plan for the NPV Component, as mandated by the National Authority. The abstract of the Five-Year Perspective Plan prepared for the state of Mizoram is as follows:
