At the outset, the Chief Executive Officer, National CAMPA welcomed DGF&SS, the members of Executive Committee and officers from the State Governments. While initiating discussion, he flagged following common issues observed in the APOs of various States, for consideration of the Executive Committee,

- Hiring/purchase of vehicles for protection and management [Rule 5(4)(d)]
- Payment of wages under various activities as payment of salaries is not permissible under Rule 5(4) (a) of the CAF Rules, 2018
- Consultation with Gram Sabha/Village level Forest Management Committee, which shall be in consonance with the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Rights) Act, 2006 [FRA, 2006]
- Development of Infrastructure [Rule 5(4)(e)]

After detailed deliberations, the Executive Committee arrived at the following conclusions:

- i. The Compensatory Afforestation Fund, Rules 2018 (CAF Rules) prohibit purchase of vehicles for officers although protection of plantations and forests is one of the permissible activities under 5(2) (d). Purchase of new vehicles should be discouraged and it should be resorted to only after all efforts for hiring of vehicles have been exhausted. If the last option of purchase is exercised, it will not entail provisioning of post of driver etc. from State CAMPA funds.
- ii. Payment of wages for permissible activities with a targeted output as per the approved Annual Plan of Operation (APO) is admissible. Payment of salaries and allowances for State CAMPA members and staff is admissible from 60% of the interest accrued component. [Rule 6(a)(iv)]

- iii. All the state officials present in the meeting voiced the concern that consultation with Gram Sabha or Village Forest Management Committee while framing the APO in consonance with Forest Rights Act, 2006, will be extremely difficult and impractical. The Executive Committee, therefore, decided that prior consultation is mandatory with Gram Sabha or VFMC at the time of implementation of each activity contained in the APO. Provisions of FRA, 2006 and associated guidelines shall be strictly adhered to. It was also advised that all consultations with Gram Sabha and VFMC may be recorded.
- iv. Construction of residential and official buildings for officers above the Forest Range Officer of the State Forest Department is not permissible under Rule 5(4)
 (e). As per Rule 6(b), not more than 40% of interest accrued could be utilised for non-recurring and recurring expenditure of the State Authority.

The Executive Committee advised the State Officials that while framing APO, all proposed activities from monies of net present value (NPV) and interest accrued may be provided in a tabular Form duly providing for their financial implications with specific mention of relevant CAF Rule, 2018 for admissibility. The activities proposed in APOs shall be in accordance with the prescriptions under respective working plans and management plans, as the case may be.

The APO was approved subject to the amendment of non-permissible activities and the outlay of the APO was to be revised accordingly and informed to the National Authority for record. The financial approval was to be issued after receiving the revised APO from the Steering Committee incorporating the clarification and observations made. However, the Mizoram State Authority in its reply vide letter no. B22018/1/2017-CAMPA/PCCF/79 dated 22nd July 2019, neither sent the revised APO nor any clarification. No representative from the State Government attended the meeting. Hence, it was decided to issue a reminder to the State to immediately act on the decision taken in the third meeting of EC of the National Authority and that till then the approval of APO would be on hold.

i. Agenda Item No.9: Annual Plan of Operation-Chhattisgarh (2019-20)

The approval was to be issued after receiving clarifications regarding observations made above.

Thereafter, Chhattisgarh State Authority submitted a revised proposal vide its letter no. 133/2019/4063 dated 23.09.2019, which was put up before the Executive Committee for examination and consideration. Chief Executive Officer, State CAMPA presented the detailed component wise activities of the revised APO before the Committee. While responding to rationalisation of 43% of expenditure from interest accrued on compensatory levies, the state authority has explained that interest to the tune of Rs.347.50 crores will accrue for the year 2018-19 and if it is added to the interest already received by Chhattisgarh (Rs.822.47 crores), the share of expenditure from interest is only 30%. The Committee deliberated upon the clarifications and observed that while interest calculation can be firmed up separately, the issue is that huge amount is proposed to be spent in the current year. While approving the APO with following observations, the Committee advised that State Authority may like to rework the proposed expenditure and communicate the same to National Authority for records:

- > There should not be a reduction in allocation for forestry sector in the State Budget due to flow of CAMPA funds.
- > The State shall furnish a brief description and abstract of the monitoring work done by the Monitoring and Evaluation Wing of the SFD and by the independent monitor in the State as desired in Part I (f) & (g) respectively of Form XII, to the National Authority for records.
- > Construction of WBM roads under 20% NPV is approved. However, better and durable options for strengthening of roads may also be explored.





r. Agenda Item No.18: Annual Plan of Operation-Sikkim (2019-20)

The APO for 2019-20 of Sikkim, with a proposed outlay of Rs 54.38 crores was discussed in the 2nd Executive Committee meeting of National Authority held on 26.04.2019. The APO was approved, subject to amendment for non-permissible activities and the revised APO was to be informed to the National Authority for record. Thereafter, the State Authority submitted its reply vide letter no. A-4(2016-17) FCA/FEWMD/239 dated 4th October 2019, which was put up before the Executive Committee for examination and consideration. PCCF & HOFF was present in the meeting. The Executive Committee deliberated upon the clarifications and accepted the same with following observations:
