Observations on the APO as per the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Act, 2016 and the CAF Rules, 2018 are provided below:

- 1. The APO is without requisite certificate from the state authorities regarding activities proposed are in consultation with Gram Sabha or Village Forest Management Committee and are in consonance with the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act 2006.
- 2. Activities proposed in Protected Areas are without certification that proposed activities are as per approved management plan.
- 3. Steering Committee's decision that APO shall be limited to budgetary allocation of Rs 200 crores is not correct. State Government shall provide adequate budgetary support as per approval accorded by the Executive Committee of National Authority.

- 4. APO is without basis of estimation and prevailing approved wage rates in the State.
- 5. Lump sum provisioning has been done for catchment treatment of river Ganga and strengthening of permanent nursery infrastructure. Details of Rs 3.0 crores activity need submission.
- 6. Allocation for independent monitoring & evaluation of Rs 2.0 crores is only around 0.5% of the total outlay which is low.
- 7. Details regarding greening of denuded hills for Rs 2.00 crores has not been provided in the APO.
- 8. There exists a huge backlog of compensatory afforestation of the tune of 20,200.00 ha, it is proposed in the APO to achieve the backlog targets in next four financial years which is a long period and there are chances of further accumulation of backlog.
- 9. Funding of city greening scheme can be sourced from National Fund rather allocating State Fund for the same.

The APO is without requisite certificate from the state authorities regarding activities proposed are in consultation with the Gram Sabha or Village Forest Management Committee and are in consonance with the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act 2006.
- 2. All the site-specific activities like Compensatory Afforestation, Catchment Area Treatment Plans, Integrated Wildlife Management Plans and other Site-Specific Plans are without adequate nos of geographical coordinates/geo-tags.
- 3. Wildlife Management activities proposed in Protected Areas or forest areas are without certification that proposed activities are as per approved management plan or working plan.
- 4. Dovetailing of activities under Forest Fire Prevention and Control Operations are to be done as per the provisions of the State Forest Fire Action Plan prepared.
- 5. APO is without basis of estimation and prevailing approved wage rates in the State.
- 6. Monitoring and evaluation has not been incorporated in APO of 2020-21.
- 7. Form VI as per the CAF Rules, 2018 has not been provided with the APO.
- 8. Details of proposed activity of providing basic infrastructure to tribal settlements at the cost of Rs 27.50 lakhs have not been provided. Therefore, admissibility of the activity as per the CAF Rule, 2018 cannot be ascertained.

The APO is without requisite certificate from the state authorities regarding activities proposed are in consultation with the Gram Sabha or Village Forest Management Committee and are in consonance with the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act 2006.
- 3. All the site-specific activities like Compensatory Afforestation, ANR and other Site-Specific activities are without adequate number of geographical coordinates/geo-tags.
- 4. Minutes of the meeting of the State Steering Committee held on 30th May 2020 has not been provided.
- 5. Approved wage rates and basis of estimation has not been provided in the document submitted digitally.
- 6. Details regarding purchase of protection equipment (Rs 0.49 crores) has not been provided.
- 7. In SMC details of quantum of percolation tanks/contour trenches etc. amounting to Rs 9.57 crores has not been provided.
- 8. Wildlife Management related activities proposed in Protected Areas or in forest areas are without certification that proposed activities are as per approved management plan or working plan.
- 9. Planting and rejuvenation of forest cover in non-forest land in wildlife corridors, a proposed activity of Rs 7.82 crores is without essential details like ownership details, consent of owner, location, post planting management etc.
- 10. Details regarding purchase/maintenance of communication and information technology equipment for forest and wildlife management amounting to Rs 1.00 crores has not been provided.
- 11. Location details of residential and official infrastructure for staff needs submission. Proposal for construction of ladies' hostel and classroom for staff training for Rs 8.00 crores from NPV needs submission.
