INFORMATION ABOUT FOURTH MEETING OF GOVERNING BODY OF NATIONAL AUTHORITY CAMPA HELD ON 29.12.2023

The minutes of Fourth Governing Body (GB) meeting of the National Authority have been circulated on 29.12.2023 vide office letter no. NA-5/10/2022-NA dated 10.01.2024. The minutes of the meeting have been circulated through mail.

Important decisions taken by the Governing Body are placed below;

- The schemes/projects submitted by various implementing agencies through concerned Programme Division for support from the National Fund were recommended by Executive Committee of National Authority in its 25th, 26th and 27th meetings. The Governing Body ratified fourteen schemes approved by HMEF&CC & approved three schemes/projects.
- 2. The GB approved the Annual Accounts of National Authority for the FY 2022-23 along with the Annual Accounts for the year 2018-19 to 2021-22 after these were certified by C&AG audit in financial statement for 2022-23. The GB further authorised the CEO, National Authority for laying of the annual accounts of 5 years from 2018-19 to 2022-23 in the Parliament through the Ministry after incorporation of the Annual Accounts in the Annual Report of the corresponding year in view of the C&AG certification.
- 3. The GB approved the existing procedure of depositing of compensatory levies by the user agencies in the State specific bank accounts maintained in the Union Bank of India, CGO complex, New Delhi by the National Authority and thereafter transferring it to the Public Accounts of India.
- 4. The GB approved the Annual Report for the year 2022-23 placed by National Authority.
- 5. The GB approved the guidelines for procurement of vehicle and the proposal to purchase multi-utility vehicle for meeting the operational requirements of forest frontline staff of State/UT Forest Department from the NPV component of State CAMPA funds. The proposal will form part of Annual Plan of Operation of respective States/UTs for approval of National CAMPA. National Authority already transferred funds to States/UTs in their public account in January & February, 2024.

#### 16.5 TAMIL NADU STATE AUTHORITY

Under PART-E ADDITIONAL AGENDA ITEM NO.6 Revised Annual Plan of Operation (APO) of Tamil Nadu State CAMPA for Financial Year 2023-24 with an outlay of Rs. 42.171 crore with mandatory activity for Rs. 16.01 crore was tabled in the 26th Meeting of Executive Committee (EC) of National CAMPA and it was decided to defer it as the CEO, State CAMPA or concerned Officers were not present in the meeting.

Earlier, The APO 2023-24 of Tamil Nadu State CAMPA for on outlay of Rs. 42.1712 crore with mandatory activity Rs. 16.01 crore was placed before the Executive Committee during its 24th Meeting on 31.08.2023. However, approval was accorded for total modified outlays for Rs. 44.149 crore by National Authority in compliance of orders of Hon'ble Madras High Court. Further, Rs. 10.746 crore out of Rs. 44.149 crore was approved for mandatory activities.

Further, it is to mention that, based on the opinion of the Additional Solicitor General, Government of India, a Special Leave Petition has been filed in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on 06.11.2023 challenging the order of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras in the matter of W.M.P (MD). No. 1962 of 2022 in WP(MD) Nos. 19771 & 23901 of 2018, 8222 & 19652 of 2020 filed by Thiru. S. Manoj Immanuvel and others. The apex court in its order dated 04.01.2024, directed the following:

- 1. Counsel appearing on behalf of the State of Tamil Nadu seeks short adjournment to file a reply.
- 2. Reply be filed within four weeks. Rejoinder thereto, if an, be filed within two weeks thereafter.
- 3. List the Petition on a non-miscellaneous day for final disposal on 27 February 2024.

Till 01.03.2024, this Authority has not received any counter reply as directed by the apex court, nor the Central Law Agency has intimated any such counter reply in this regard.

The revised APO for the Financial Year 2023-24 is placed again for appropriate decision.

The related documents is placed at Annexure X.

#### 16.6 UTTAR PRADESH STATE AUTHORITY

The Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Executive Officer, Uttar Pradesh, vide letter no. 512/2-37-2 dated 10th January 2024, along with letter no. 548/2-37-2 dated 19th January 2024, and letter no. 661/2-37-2 dated 19th February 2024, has submitted their request for the approval of deferred activities in APO of FY 2023-24 i.e. for **"Establishment, maintenance of animal rescue center and veterinary treatment facilities for wild animals"** for **Rs 18.13 crore** for consideration of National Authority. Earlier, the APO of Uttar Pradesh was discussed in 22nd, 23rd and 26th meeting of Executive Committee of National Authority. The EC has approved an amount of **Rs. 176.44 crore (Rs. 77.18 crore, Rs. 76.74 crore** and **Rs. 22.52 crore** approved during the 22nd, 23rd and 26th meeting of Executive Committee of National Authority, respectively) out of the proposed outlay of **Rs. 190.00 crore** till date (as communicated via sanction order dated 4th May 2023, 3rd July 2023 and 20th December 2023) and some activities were deferred and partially approved. National Authority has approved **Rs 40.38 crore (52.06% of available funds with the state)** out of proposed **Rs 140.92 crore** in NPV.

Its pertinent to mention that, Central Zoo Authority while according approval recommended *that the State Government shall explore possibilities of Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) for financial support required for the establishment of rescue facilities. CAMPA funds should not be utilised for the said establishments.*
