# THE MINUTES OF THE 28th MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE NATIONAL AUTHORITY

The 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) of the National Authority was held in Krishna Conference Room, Indira Paryavaran Bhawan, New Delhi on 22<sup>nd</sup> March, 2024 under the Chairmanship of the Director General of Forests & Special Secretary (DGF&SS), MoEF&CC. The list of participants in the meeting is attached at Annexure I.

#### GENERAL DISCUSSION AND DIRECTIONS OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

The CEO, National Authority welcomed the Chairman and the members of the Executive Committee and other participants.

- 1) Initiating the agenda-wise discussion, CEO informed that during the 26th meeting of the Executive Committee it was decided that APOs for 2024-25 will be considered for approval of the National Authority only when the information on the reconciliation of project wise compensatory afforestation against each proposal for forest land diversion since 1980 is completed by the concerned state and provided to the National Authority dully vetted by concerned IRO. States have been requested several times in this regard to expedite it. As of now, the National Authority has received the aforementioned information from Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Jammu & Kashmir, Odisha, Rajasthan, and Tamil Nadu only. He further informed that reconciled information has also been received from Assam, Chandigarh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Mizoram, Tripura, Uttarakhand and West Bengal but the reconciled data of each State/UT is to be vetted by the concerned IROs. He requested all Heads of Regional Offices of the Ministry (IROs) to give special attention for completion of reconciliation of CA against each project since 1980 for the States/ UTs under their jurisdiction at the earliest. Additionally, a Completion Certificate shall be provided by the State/UTs against each completed CA where no further maintenance is needed.
- 2) The DGF&SS asked the States/UTs to upload the KML files of the plantations and other site-specific activities timely on e-Green Watch portal for ease of monitoring and transparency. The KML file of all site-specific afforestation and other activities carried out under CAMPA should be shared with the Forest Survey of India (FSI) for monitoring and evaluation purposes.
- 3) The DGF&SS emphasised the need to reconcile the legacy data on forest land diversions against each approvals under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 since 1980 by all the States/UTs at the earliest and asked all the States/UTs and concerned IROs to expedite it. However, to avoid disruption of process of finalisation of the State/ UTs APOs for FY 2024-25 the Executive Committee considered approval of mandatory afforestation and seasonal activities so that the committed works are not affected. For other activities the

Executive Committee will consider in its subsequent meetings and the States/UTs were asked to complete their reconciliation process before the next meeting.

- 4) The CEO, National CAMPA informed the Executive Committee that the reconciled fund of State CAMPA have been transferred upto 31.03.2022 during January, 2024 in compliance of the directions of the Governing Body. Further, the States were requested to confirm timely release of CAMPA fund to the State Forest Department for carrying out activities approved in the APO and credit of accrued interest on the State CAMPA funds available in the public accounts of the State. However, many of the States/UTs have not confirmed about timely credit of accrued interest in State CAMPA. Therefore, the reconciled CAMPA fund upto March, 2023 could not be transferred to States in absence of confirmation of credit of accrued annual interest.
- 5) The CEO, National Authority also stressed upon the need of preparing a perspective plan by the respective States/UTs that will be followed by various States/UTs for enhancing the effectiveness of planning and implementation of the CAMPA activities. He further informed that he has requested the Chief Secretaries of the States/UTs to strengthen the State CAMPA for effective implementation of CAMPA activities vide official letter no. NA-13/6/2020-NA-Part (1) dated 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2024. The States/UTs should strengthen their State CAMPA offices with adequate technical/ professional manpower for proper discharge of the assigned mandatory responsibilities and functions under the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Act, 2016 and Rules, 2018.
- 6) Further, CEO presented the status of release of fund and expenditure in the States for implementation of approved activities of the APOs. He apprised EC that in many of the States, the release of the CAMPA Fund to the State Forest Department against approved APO is delayed by the concerned State Governments adversely affecting the implementation of time-bound and seasonal forestry activities. The Executive Committee expressed serious concern as delayed release of CAMPA fund to the Forest Department will adversely affect the quality of nursery and the survival and growth of plantations. Further, Shri Anil Kumar Ganeriwala, Expert Member of the Executive Committee, mentioned that the sanctity of the entire process of approval of Annual Plan of Operations is vitiated when State Governments do not release funds for implementation which is a legal obligation of the State to compensate the loss of forest and ecosystem services due to diversion of forest land. The DGF&SS expressed concern that many States/UTs have not released the fund for the FY 2023-24 for carrying out CAMPA activities which is against the spirit of the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Act, 2016 and Rules, 2018. The DGF&SS urged PCCF & HoFF of States to take up with the State Governments for timely release of funds. The process for release of CAMPA funds for carrying out approved/ committed activities may be simplified by the State Government to ensure timely availability of funds for forestry and wildlife activities.
- 7) The Executive committee was informed that the Governing Body meetings of States/UTs CAMPA have not taken place in many States/UTs. The DGF&SS drew attention to the provisions of the Compensatory Afforestation Rules, 2018 according to which the

Sate/UT Steering Committee, Executive Committee and Governing Body meetings should take place regularly and timely. The States/UTs were requested to ensure that meeting of the Governing Body in states takes place twice every year as per the Section 17(3) of the CAF Act, 2016. Further, the DGF&SS requested PCCF & HoFF to take up with the Chief Minister's office for convening Governing Body of State Authority in States as per the provision of the Act.

- 8) The DGF&SS emphasized that the meetings of the Steering Committee in States should be conducted every quarter to review the release of funds and progress. The matter should be taken up by the State CAMPA with the State Government regularly.
- 9) The Executive Committee was informed that the National Authority has started new official email id: <a href="mailto:nationalcampa-moefce@gov.in">nationalcampa-moefce@gov.in</a>. It was also informed that National Authority is in process of developing an official website of National CAMPA, which is likely to be launched soon. Also, a platform dedicated for online submission and processing of APOs of respective States/UTs is being developed in consultation with respective States/UTs, which is under trial and testing. The online processing of digital APO will facilitate efficiency and transparency. The support of the States and UTs is very important for making the digital APO portal effective and efficient.
- 10) The DGF&SS stressed the need for strengthening the internal monitoring mechanism of the State/UTs Forest Department for regular & concurrent monitoring. He requested States/UTs Forest Department to place the data of Compensatory Afforestation and other activities on the websites of States/UTs CAMPA or Forest Department for transparency.
- 11) The DGF&SS mentioned that we should aim to have comprehensive and holistic ecological restoration of the afforestation efforts under CAMPA and therefore the Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) framework should capture all necessary criteria and indicators for ecological restoration. He requested CEO, National CAMPA to have consultations with the PCCF & HoFFs and CEOs CAMPA of States and national forestry institutions viz. ICFRE, IIFM and FSI etc. for review of existing M&E framework and take necessary action for further improvement in internal and external monitoring framework, if necessary. The States/UTs are requested to continue the present system of monitoring, ensure maintaining the legacy records and the institutions/agencies selected for third party monitoring should have sufficient expertise in the field to carry out effective monitoring and evaluation of afforestation and ecological restoration.
- 12) The DGF&SS directed all the States/UTs should have a Hi-Tech/ Model nursery in each division/district. National Authority is developing a nursery portal for maintaining its records across the nation and distributing the saplings to the local communities. The data may be uploaded by July, 2024.
- 13) The CEO National CAMPA informed the Executive Committee that the progress of the Nagar Van Yojana is slow. The state forest departments should make all out efforts to

- expand creation of Nagar Van across the country for improvement of urban environment, climate change resilience, biodiversity conservation and others associated benefits.
- 14) The AS&FA informed that all Centrally Sponsored Schemes of the Ministry will soon be a part of the SNA Sparsh, which will be a model working on the basis of reimbursement after expenditure by the States. He further urged the States to ensure timely and prudent utilisation of CAMPA fund.
- 15) The DGF&SS appreciated the objectives of the Green Credit Programme and mentioned the 14 participating States/UTs. Other States were requested to be on board as participating States/UTs for the scheme holding National importance.
- 16) The Executive committee unanimously decided that during the enforcement of model code of conduct in view of the ensuing Lok Sabha elections, no new activities, including construction of buildings, procurement of vehicle, equipment, and engagement of new labours should be undertaken except for the ongoing activities which are mandatory and seasonal in nature. Hence, in view of the Model Code of Conduct in force due to ensuing Lok Sabha election, it was decided that the seasonal and time bound activities proposed in the APO for 2024-25 by the respective states/UTs will be considered for approval. Further, it was also decided that all the approvals in 28th meeting of Executive Committee of National CAMPA will be subject to adherence by the concerned States/UTs to the Model Code of Conduct in force.
- 17) It was reiterated that the States/UTs while proposing their APOs shall ensure that the financial outlay under NPV should be restricted to the maximum 20% of the Net Present Value funds available with the States/UTs. Also, in respect of expenditure from the interest component a ceiling of 10% of funds available under the interest component with State CAMPA is prescribed to ensure proper and sustained utilization. Further, over and above 20% of the NPV, the outlay for NPV may have additional 5% for the component of demarcation of forest boundary and voluntary relocation of villages from the protected area.







Under PART-E ADDITIONAL AGENDA ITEM NO.6 Revised Annual Plan of Operation (APO) of Tamil Nadu State CAMPA for Financial Year 2023-24 with an outlay of Rs. 42.171 crore with mandatory activity for Rs. 16.01 crore was tabled in the 26<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Executive Committee (EC) of National CAMPA and it was decided to defer it as the CEO, State CAMPA or concerned Officers were not present in the meeting.

Earlier, The APO 2023-24 of Tamil Nadu State CAMPA for on outlay of Rs. 42.1712 crore with mandatory activity Rs. 16.01 crore was placed before the Executive Committee during its 24<sup>th</sup> Meeting on 31.08.2023. However, approval was accorded for total modified outlays for Rs. 44.149 crore by National Authority in compliance of orders of Hon'ble Madras High Court. Further, Rs. 10.746 crore out of Rs. 44.149 crore was approved for mandatory activities.

Further, it is to mention that, based on the opinion of the Additional Solicitor General, Government of India, a Special Leave Petition has been filed in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on 06.11.2023 challenging the order of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras in the matter of W.M.P (MD). No. 1962 of 2022 in WP(MD) Nos. 19771 & 23901 of 2018, 8222 & 19652 of 2020 filed by Thiru. S. Manoj Immanuvel and others. The apex court in its order dated 04.01.2024, directed the following:

- 1. Counsel appearing on behalf of the State of Tamil Nadu seeks short adjournment to file a reply.
- 2. Reply be filed within four weeks. Rejoinder thereto, if an, be filed within two weeks thereafter.
- 3. List the Petition on a non-miscellaneous day for final disposal on 27 February 2024.

Till 01.03.2024, this Authority has not received any counter reply as directed by the apex court, nor the Central Law Agency has intimated any such counter reply in this regard. The revised APO for the Financial Year 2023-24 is placed again for appropriate decision.

**Decision of the EC:** The State Authority Tamil Nadu was informed that the approval for mandatory activities was already conveyed to incur expenditure / take action in respect of the approved activity for Rs. 10.746 crores proposed in APO of financial year 2023–24 and communicated vide letter dated 22-09-2023 along with new plantation activity to an area of 90.95 ha. with an outlay of Rs. 1.10 crore including maintenance of ANR of 574 ha. with an outlay of Rs. 0.979 crore.so the total approved outlay would be Rs.12.825 Crore for deferred committed activities.
