THE MINUTES OF THE 30th MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE NATIONAL AUTHORITY

The 30th Meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) of the National Authority was held in Krishna Conference Room, Indira Paryavaran Bhawan, New Delhi on 7th June, 2024 under the Chairmanship of the Director General of Forests & Special Secretary (DGF&SS), MoEF&CC. The list of participants is attached at **Annexure I.**

PART A: GENERAL DISCUSSION AND DIRECTIONS OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

- The CEO, National Authority welcomed the Chairman, the members of the Executive Committee and other officers.
- 2) The DGF&SS and the Chairperson of the Executive Committee welcomed the members and other officers present in the meeting. In his opening remarks DGF &SS mentioned that Executive Committee, in its earlier meetings during the year has approved the activities listed in the APOs of the States/UTs, which are mandatory, seasonal, time bound and committed in nature so that these activities are timely carried out. He noted that there has been some improvement in the situation regarding release of CAMPA funds from previous years, still it requires to be pursued in many States. He also requested PCCF and HoFFs and CEO States/UTs CAMPA to take up the matter with the Chief Secretary and Secretary Finance for expeditious release of CAMPA funds to the Forest Department for carrying out the approved activities.
- 3) The CEO, National CAMPA informed that 24 APOs were approved for undertaking time bound, essential and seasonal activities in 28th and 29th meetings, however it has been noticed that many States have not released the CAMPA funds. Release of funds needs to be expedited.
- 4) The Executive Committee discussed many important issues regarding implementation of the CAF Act, 2016 and Rules in the States and National CAMPA. The following points were discussed and decisions taken are given below:

5.1. Approval of APOs of States/UTs CAMPA:

i. The Executive Committee has decided to restrict annual expenditure from the funds available in the State CAMPA under NPV head to ensure sustained availability of funds for undertaking comprehensive ecological restoration of degraded forests and improvement of wildlife habitat as a desired outcome. Accordingly, 20% of the NPV funds available with the State at the beginning of the financial year are approved in the APO under Rule 5(2) and 5(3) for that year for carrying out the activities of assisted natural regeneration, artificial plantation, soil moisture conservation, wildlife habitat improvement, fire control and prevention and basic infrastructure for forest frontline staff engaged for forest protection duties, etc. Further, a limit of 10% of funds available in the interest head of State CAMPA has been considered by the Executive Committee

- for rationalization of expenditure in the interest head which is committed for meeting the expenditure on account of running of State CAMPA Authority, monitoring and more importantly offsetting the cost escalation of the compensatory afforestation and other CAMPA activities due to increase in wage rates and material components, etc.
- ii. The CEO, National CAMPA informed that in spite of continuous efforts of National CAMPA, many State Authorities viz. Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Haryana, Ladakh and Manipur have not furnished their APOs for approval. It will adversely affect continuity of afforestation and other seasonal activities. The APOs of Delhi and Tamil Nadu CAMPA were received only on 31.05.2024 & 05.06.2024 (A/N) i.e. just few days before the meeting of the Executive Committee. As per the CAF Rules, 2018 the APOs of following years should be furnished to National Authority before 31st December of preceding year for proper processing of the proposals. The Executive Committee has already given direction that the APO received at least 15 days before the date of the meeting of the Committee should be taken up for discussion. The Executive Committee mentioned that the sanctity of the time lines provided in the CAF Act & Rules and instructions of this committee should be maintained by the State & Programme Divisions.
- iii. However, in the interest of implementation of seasonal and time bound activities and the compensatory afforestation being an essential condition of forest clearances, the Executive Committee took up APOs of Delhi and Tamil Nadu as table item of agenda during the meeting with the approval of the chair.

5.2 Completion of backlog compensatory afforestation:

(i) The Executive Committee emphasized that the States should accord highest priority for completion of the backlog of compensatory afforestation and carry out other mandated activities at the earliest to offset the loss of forest and ecosystem services by ecological restoration of the area earmarked for compensatory afforestation in lieu of the forest land diverted for non-forestry purpose as per provisions of Van Sanraksham Evam Samvardhan Adhiniyam, 2023 (earlier known as the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980).

(ii) Ecological restoration of Degraded Forests and Non-forests lands through Compensatory Afforestation:

The CEO, CAMPA apprised the EC that in the 4th meeting of Governing Body of the National Authority held on 29.12.2023, the ecological restoration of the degraded forest or non-forest areas on the highest priority. The states should focus on the following priorities set by the Governing Body:

i. The rejuvenation of lakes and water bodies and heritage conservation of natural assets focusing on greening coastal areas for peaceful co-existence with nature. The Forest Departments of all Coastal States should make their best efforts to implement MISHTI Programme in their State. National CAMPA is also providing financial support to States for implementation of various activities under MISHTI Programme.

- ii.Innovation in management of forest and other natural ecosystem for restoration of grassland, Aravalli restoration, restoration of Mangroves and Creeks in the coastal areas. Suitable proposals may be sent to National CAMPA in this regard.
- iii. Preservation and restoration of natural ecosystems should be given highest priority under CAMPA which should not only include only afforestation/ tree planting activity but restoring of the landscape by working with nature to help the nature to regenerate in its own ways on pilot basis for 5,000 – 10,000 acres of degraded forests. The NPV funds with the State CAMPA should be utilised primarily for eco-restoration of these areas.

The Executive Committee was informed that a meeting of the Experts Members of the Governing Body & Executive Committee was organised for detailed consultation on the ecological restoration of degraded forests. As a follow up the Guiding Principles for Ecological Restoration have been circulated to PCCF & HoFFs & Heads of Forest Departments of all States and Union Territories for comments and suggestions.

Decision: State/UT Forest Departments to take appropriate action. While proposing ANR and Artificial Regeneration under NPV the States/UTs should ensure that the degraded forest areas fall in the category of the degraded/ Open Forest in the ISFR of the FSI.

5.3 Schemes from National CAMPA Fund

INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING SUBMITTING PROPOSAL OF NEW SCHEMES SEEKING FINANCIAL SUPPORT FROM NATIONAL FUND:

- (i) While discussing on the new Schemes/Projects submitted by the respective programme divisions, the DGF&SS stressed upon the need of specifying tangible results through key performance indicators and advised the programme divisions to evolve inbuilt monitoring mechanism while formulating the project. He also advised the Heads of the programme division for continuous monitoring of the project being implemented.
 - (ii) The CEO, National CAMPA apprised the committee about the provisions in the Section 5(b)(iii) of the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Act, 2016 which deal with the scheme:-

"the expenditure incurred on specific schemes approved by Governing Body of the National Authority."

Explanation – For the purpose of this section, "scheme" includes any institute, society, centre of excellence in the field of forest and wildlife, pilot schemes, standardisation of codes and guidelines and such other related activities for the forestry and wildlife sector.

(iii) The AS&FA was of the view that any project/scheme by the programme divisions seeking financial support from National Fund should address specific gap(s) which

cannot be met through the regular CSS/other Central Sector Schemes due to emerging situations not envisaged in the ongoing Central and State schemes. The AS&FA further opined that a scheme once approved for support from National Fund should not continue indefinitely as CAMPA cannot replace the normal financial support from Government of India or a State. If a new conservation programme is required for a long period for addressing specific conservation needs and the programme objectives cannot be covered in an ongoing Central Sector/Sponsored Scheme, it may be considered to cover it under a new Central Sector/Sponsored Scheme.

- (iv) Shri Ramesh Kumar Pandey, IGF(FC) added that it is very important to ensure that while formulating any scheme it does not overlap with any other scheme of the State or Central Government and not a duplication of any effort made in past by any institutions.
- (v) Shri Anil Kumar Ganeriwala, Expert Member suggested that the project area should necessarily be delineated on the ground.
- (vi) Shri Girish Kuber, Expert Member emphasised that for restoration of degraded forests, there should be one major scheme either from CSS or from State fund.

Decision:

After detailed discussion, the Executive Committee considered and formulated following broad parameters/criteria for formulating/ proposing any scheme for the financial support from National CAMPA:

- The CAMPA Funds are an additional funds and should not be seen as an alternative to the regular budgetary financial support.
- ii. The scheme should be new or a pilot to initiate or implement an innovative idea/ technology to address any gap(s) in the present research, conservation programmes as noted in the para 5 (ii) above and should not be an arrangement for meeting the shortage of funds in an ongoing Schemes or Programmes.
- iii. The scheme should have clearly defined programme objectives and timelines with measurable and monitorable outcomes, sunset clause and exit strategy. The exit strategy should include proper handholding to stakeholder departments and organisations to continue/sustain the outcomes or the gains made under the scheme without depending upon the National CAMPA Fund for indefinite long period.
- iv. The Scheme may be taken up as a model of convergence but its activities should not be overlapping with any other Central Sponsored Scheme, Central Sector Scheme & State's Programmes & Schemes.
- The Programme Division should also inform about the efforts made to explore funding of the Scheme form their regular as well as other alternative sources.
- Further, it has to be ensured by the Implementing Institution and the Programme Division that there will not be any liability on account of legal, establishment,

- commercial or of any other form on National CAMPA for financially supporting the implementation of the scheme or after its completion.
- While submitting the proposal for the scheme, the programme division should clearly mention that the proposal has the approval of the competent authority.
- viii. The programme division and implementing agency should have in-built continuous monitoring mechanism in the scheme and also have provision for mid-term review.

5.4. Utilisation of funds under CSS of the Ministry:

The CEO, National CAMPA apprised the EC that the CAMPA funds comprise the compensatory levies received from various User Agencies for compensating the loss of forest land and ecosystem services due to diversion of forests for non-forestry purposes as per provisions of the Van Sanrakshan evam Samvardhan Adhiniyam, 2023 (the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980). He further clarified that CAMPA Funds are realised only once from the User Agency and are not a regular stream of fund flow. The CAMPA funds are an additional and special funds and States/UTs should avoid their use in routine forestry and wildlife activities like protection of forests, fire control and prevention, Biodiversity Conservation, wildlife habitat management and essential forest protection infrastructure like hiring of vehicles, construction of frontline staff quarters and offices etc which are primarily the responsibility of the State Governments. The CAMPA funds must instead be used to bring long term measurable and sustainable outcomes leading to improvement of quality, density and biodiversity of forests for optimizing their ecosystem services.

The AS&FA mentioned that it has been observed that the States have a tendency to supplement their shortage of funds in the CSS and regular State Funds from CAMPA. Instead, the States/UTs should focus on better preparation of annual plans, implementation and utilisation of CSS and State Schemes. He stressed that the in the Integrated APOs, it has been noticed that States are more inclined to use CAMPA Funds where they can also use funds under relevant CSS. Therefore, there should be first priority to utilse funds from relevant CSS and regular State Plan but there is not much progress in this regard in spite of repeatedly raising the issue in various meetings.

5.5 Delay in release of CAMPA Funds by State/UT Governments to Forest Departments:

(i) The CEO, National CAMPA informed that the EC was informed from time to time that lot of time is spent in the release of the State CAMPA fund available with the State Government to the Forest Department for carrying out the approved activities of the APO timely. The details of the funds released by the State Government and its utilisation by the State Forest Department for implementation of approved CAMPA activities is placed in the Table- 6 of the integrated APO of the concerned State. The officers from the State Forest Department informed even when the funds are available, the bills are lying pending with the treasury for payment for months together.

- (ii) The CEO, National CAMPA mentioned that due to delayed release or partial release of funds, the physical and financial targets of compensatory afforestation and other CAMPA activities are not achieved as envisaged in the APO of that year resulting in low fund utilisation, which leads to incomplete or spillover of works and disturbs the planned implementation of afforestation and seasonal activities adversely affecting the quality of plantation, fire protection and forest protection of the next cycle of CAMPA activities.
- (iii) The DGF&SS expressed concern that this delay in release of funds adversely affects the progress and outcomes of the approved activities, many of which are mandatory as well as seasonal in nature and has to be carried out timely in compliance of the terms and conditions of the approval for forest clearance accorded by the Central Government for non-forestry use of a specific forest land under Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 2023.
- (iv)The DGF&SS stressed that such an extraordinary and avoidable delay in release of CAMPA funds by the State Governments may lead to non-compliance of the terms and conditions mentioned in the approval of diversion of forest land under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 now known as Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 2023. Therefore, EC desired that States may be impressed upon that non implementation of the activities of compensatory afforestation and eco restoration for compensating the loss of ecosystem services may lead to non-implementation of the essential conditions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

5.6 Delayed release affecting Seasonal and time bound forestry & wildlife activities:

Delay in release of funds affects seasonal matters including preparedness for prevention & control of forest fire adversely therefore, PCCF & HoFF of the States/UTs are requested to kindly taken up the matter with the Chief Secretary of their States/UTs for timely release of fund under the CAMPA.

5.7 Rationalisation of Expenditure under NPV and Interest for Sustainability:

The CEO, National CAMPA informed that many of the State APOs has financial outlay under NPV on the much higher side of the NPV amount available with the State. However, pursuant to the directions of the Executive Committee, the amount under NPV and Interest component of the APOs have been rationalised upto 20% of the NPV and 10% of the Interest Funds available with the States/UTs, except in special programme/Projects, where it can go upto 25 % of NPV component.

5.8 Credit of annual interest on State CAMPA Funds by the States/UTs:

(i) The CEO, National CAMPA updated the Executive Committee that only Chandigarh, Haryana, Goa, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Mizoram, Odisha, Punjab, Tripura, Uttarakhand and West Bengal have credited the amount of accrued annual interest on States/UTs CAMPA fund upto the Financial Year, 2023. The CAMPA Funds are interest bearing and credit of accrued interest is required as per the provisions of the CAF Act, 2016. The reminders to remaining States are regularly sent.

Decision:

The CEO, States/UTs CAMPA to take up with their respective State/UT Government for timely credit of annual interest on State/UT CAMPA funds as it is required as per the Act and may adversely affect CAMPA activities under the interest head.

(ii) The rate of interest on CAMPA funds: Many States present in the meeting raised the issues that the rate of interest on CAMPA funds allowed in last three four years is ranging between 3.0 and 3.4 which will not be sufficient to take care of raise in wages and increase in cost of material due to inflation. Since CAMPA funds are required for long term afforestation and forest protection measures the rate of interest should be commensurate to meet the future commitment.

Decision:

The CEO, CAMPA to initiate suitable proposal for addressing the issue.

5.9 Reconciliation of data of Compensatory Afforestation since 1980:

The CEO, National CAMPA informed that reconciled data on Compensatory Afforestation duly vetted by IROs on forest land diversions against each approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 since 1980 has been received from Jammu & Kashmir, and Rajasthan only till date. However, 22 States have compiled data which is yet to be vetted by the Regional Office of the Ministry. Remaining 10 States/UTs are yet to furnished vetted reconciled data.

The Executive Committee expressed concern that despite its direction to reconcile the compensatory afforestation against each forest diversion proposal since 1980 by the State Governments and verification of the data by the committee of DDG, (Head) of Regional Office of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, State Nodal Officer, FCA and the CEO, State CAMPA, the information is still yet to be received from the Committee constituted for the purpose. The DDG, (Head) of Regional Office of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, PCCF & HoFF/PCCF or Head of State Forest Departments and the CEO, State CAMPA present in the meeting were requested to complete the reconciliation of compensatory afforestation against each forest diversion proposal at the earliest.

Decision:

The DDGs of Regional Offices of the Ministry to complete this exercise for remaining States within two months. The ADG, FC to regularly monitor the progress for ensuring timely completion of the reconciliation of Compensatory Afforestation data against each forest diversion proposal.

5.10 Monitoring & evaluation of CAMPA activities:

- (i) The CEO, National CAMPA informed that States/UTs are required to upload KML files of afforestation and other site-specific activities on the e- Green Watch portal. In respect of Compensatory Afforestation and other mandatory activities, the KML files should be same which have been approved by the Ministry during FCA approvals. He further informed the Executive Committee that the National CAMPA is in the process of compiling complete data on achievements of Compensatory Afforestation and assisted/ artificial natural regeneration since 2018-19 when the CAF Act, 2016 came into force.
- (ii) The CEO, National CAMPA informed that the States/UTs CEO CAMPA have been requested to give completion certificate for the completed project wise CA schemes, so that the compliance of the condition regarding CA mentioned in the approval accorded under FCA, 1980 could be brought on record.
- (iii) The IGF (FC) stressed the need for mentioning status of CA accomplished and CA backlog in the APO as well as approval conveyed by the National CAMPA. The completion of compensatory afforestation is a mandatory condition in compliance of FC approval.
- (iv) The ADG, FC stressed that the e-Greenwatch needs to be strengthen and upgraded to ensure regular monitoring of the Compensatory afforestation and other CAMPA activities which are required to be done for compliance of the FC Act. Many States have informed that it is very difficult to edit and update KML file and other information in existing e-Greenwatch portal.
- (v) The Executive Committee noted that the Monitoring Group meetings are not being convened since last one year which is required to be conducted at least every three months as provided in the CAF Act. The CEO, National CAMPA was asked to place the facts before the DGF&SS for appropriate direction.

Decision:

- The DG, FSI will take necessary action in coordination with NIC for upgradation of e-Greenwatch portal.
- The DDGs of Regional Offices of the Ministry to regularly monitor the progress of compensatory afforestation and other CAMPA activities and send monitoring

reports to IGF, FC. The ADG, FC was requested to review the progress of Compensatory Afforestation against each forest diversion proposal.

- (iii) The State Forest Department should ensure regular Third Party Monitoring every year for monitoring and evaluation of Compensatory Afforestation and other CAMPA activities. In addition, the rigorous internal monitoring mechanism should be followed with proper record keeping including maintaining kml files on websites of the State or UT Forest Department and the State/UT CAMPA. Remote Sensing Technology should be used for quick and effective monitoring. The sites and Kml files of the compensatory afforestation and other site-specific mandatory activities must be the same as have been approved by the Central Government while granting FCA approvals.
- (iv) The State Forest Departments should send kml files of all afforestation and site specific CAMPA activities to Forest Survey of India through e-mail with a copy to National Authority immediately after completion of the activity.

5.11 PREPARATION OF PERSPECTIVE PLAN FOR CAMPA ACTIVITIES:

The CEO, National CAMPA informed that the States & UTs CAMPA Authorities have been requested time to time since 2021 to prepare Perspective Plans for at least 5 years for planning and implementation of various CAMPA activities in a systematic and integrated manner for bringing lasting qualitative improvement in the forests, biodiversity and ecosystem services. The Perspective Plans should identify the degraded forest areas for sustained restorative actions and can be monitored for long term through e Greenwatch or suitable Platforms of Remote Sensing Technology periodically. The Perspective Plans are essential for proper planning and use of NPV Funds which must focus on long term needs of Forest Departments and gaps in critical funding, so that these are addressed on priority. Perspective Plans will also help in proper assessments and appreciation of the States' requirements for CAMPA Funds for priority action and will lead to speedy approvals of APOs. However, the States and UTs have not yet prepared Perspective Plans.

Decision:

The DGF&SS desired that the States and UTs CAMPA should prepare Perspective Plans for systematic implementation of CAMPA activities by prioritising activities especially for comprehensive restoration of degraded forests.

The Executive Committee confirmed the minutes of the 29th EC held on 15.05.2024.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2.1: ACTION TAKEN REPORT ON 29th MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Decision of EC: As per State request, the EC has approved the State APO with suitable modifications. The EC agreed to reduce Rs. 1.51 crore of approved amount from the total approved amount of Rs. 3.01 crore in the 28th meeting under NPV head. Since the NPV was exceeding the 20% limit due to committed liabilities of previous years, the State was advised to rationalize the NPV by dropping, reducing and not approving some of the activities/items of works. - Standard protocol for production and management and OPM, native bio-inoculants.

Decision of EC: The EC deferred the proposal and took the view that some work on identification of degraded landscapes in Himalayan Region might have been done by various intuitions like NRSC, G.B. Pant National Institute of Himalayan Environment, Indian Institute of Remote Sensing, Desertification and Land Degradation Atlas etc. It is not clear whether the exercise is for study purpose of identification of landscapes, drivers of land degradation, restorative ecology and strategy for restoration or the Scheme/ project also involves activities of ecological restoration of such land in the projected timeframe of 7 years.

Therefore, ICFRE should first find out the gaps in the information and knowledge in the existing studies for selection of landscapes for the purpose of the scheme. The role and responsibilities of various stakeholders such as forest departments, other departments, local communities and scientific institutions in the restoration process should also be identified alongwith defined outcomes on ground and key performance indicators. The Programme Division should obtain activity-wise breakup based on the observations of EC for identified landscapes for restoration.

Project Outcomes: Annexure- I

Reason for No Cost Extension:

- Of the scheme, Component 1 has 31 All India Coordinated Research Projects (AICRPs) which includes 13 Species based and 18 Theme based research projects. These projects got initiated during February, 2020 but the beginning of the projects coincided with the unprecedented situation arisen due to the PANDEMIC (COVID-19). As majority of the projects involved field activities like surveys, population identification, collection of data on maturity indices, collection of seed, site selection for field trials etc. adversely got impacted due to travel restrictions imposed by different state governments from time to time during 2020-2021 and 2021-2022. This resulted in affecting the progress of research projects. The establishment of field trials for which site selection was planned to be carried out in the first year, resulted in late establishment of field trials and hence, subsequent recording of growth parameters also got delayed.
- The pandemic emergency not only restricted the field operations but also affected the office working and hampered the fund flow for the scheme during 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 as the budget was not released on yearly basis as approved in the sanction order but in instalments.
- Of the other five components, the Component 4 (REDD+) which involved capacity development
 programme for stakeholders was completed by organizing mostly ONLINE trainings on REDD+
 for the SFD personnel of all the states of the country during pandemic time. The various activities
 under Component 2 (FGR), Component 3 (CFPR), Component 5 (HRD) and Component 6 (FES)
 are yet to be completed.

Artharh

 In view of the above facts, it would be difficult to complete the envisaged activities of the scheme under different components including many AICRPs to arrive at conclusive results and give recommendations.

Decision of EC: The EC expressed concern on the slow progress of the Scheme. This is a very important Umbrella Scheme aiming at ecological sustainability, quality of forests and enhancement of forest productivity. The EC advised the Programme Division to review the Progress with ICFRE and make concerted efforts to include other similar important research projects in this Umbrella Scheme for overall improvement of the quality of forests, biodiversity and productivity of tree plantations. If required, the Scheme can continue as a long term umbrella Research Programme of the ICFRE. The ICFRE should also focus on proper extension and publicity of the research outcomes to stakeholders for adaptation in the field.

The EC recommended for no cost extension to the project. The EC desired that the Programme Division should monitor the Research Outcomes achieved so far and place a comprehensive report in the next EC meeting. Also, Executive Committee did not recommend any foreign visit by any official using the National CAMPA Fund for this Scheme/ Project.

As per section 15. (1) (iv) of CAF Act, 2016 the Executive Committee of the National Authority vested power and functions to deploy staff on contract or on deputation basis to the posts in the National Authority. The matter regarding engagement/outsource the Office Assistants and Office Attendants (Agenda Item No.20.2) was considered in the 20th meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Authority held on 20th November, 2022 and it was recommended that National Authority can approach NICSI/GeM for engaging contractual staff of National Authority.

- 2. It is intimated that with the financial concurrence accorded by the Integrated Finance Division (IFD), an agreement/contract for outsourcing/engagement of staff in the National Authority CAMPA was concluded on 4th July'2023 for four years with M/s AeoLogic Technologies Pvt. Ltd, Noida (empaneled vendor of NICSI & BECIL) @ 6.93 % operating margin for the period from 01.04.2023 to 31.03.2024 as per the standard terms & conditions. The service provider M/s AeoLogic Technologies Pvt. Ltd, Noida vide letter 9/4/2023 requested for release of work order for the current financial year 2024-25 with the existing terms & conditions of the agreement. The case for extension of the contract/agreement for outsourcing/ engagement of staff (eight Office Assistants and eight Office Attendants) in the National CAMPA with provision of additional three Office Assistants and three Office Attendants for a further period of one year from. 01.04.2024 to 31.03.2025 is under process in consultation with IFD.
- 3. Further, the official CAMPA website as a single window access to various CAMPA works is under development (in-house) since Nov, 2023. A short-term engagement of technical man power for IT, programming, testing and maintenance support of the website is proposed for its efficient and smooth functioning on the NIC server.
 Similarly, services of Legal Advisor/Expert, CA/CSs, Finance& Accounts experts, technically qualified manpower's in the field of GIS/MIS, Forestry Research etc were required in time to time in National CAMPA.
- 4. It is proposed that on short term requirements of National Authority, the service provider shall provide additional/ technically qualified manpower's in the field of GIS/MIS, Forestry Research, IT, Website development, Programming, Legal, Accounts & Finance Expert, and CA/CSs etc. at the remuneration decided by the CEO, National CAMPA Authority. The vendor/ service provider is eligible to charge approved profit margin to the extent of agreed quantum.
- 5. Decision sought: The Executive Committee may like to recommend /approve the following-
 - (i) Extension of the contract/agreement for outsourcing/ engagement of staff in the National Authority CAMPA for a further period of one year from. 01.04.2024 to 31.03.2025 with provision of additional three Office Assistants and three Office Attendants.
