Monitoring Mechanism adopted for Monitoring & Evaluation of CAMPA activities in Assam.

The preliminary monitoring of works implemented under Assam State CAMPA is done
by the Divisional Forest Officers / Assistant Conservator of Forests / Range Officers of
the Division. Further, monitoring of works is also done by the senior officials of the
department. Percentage of number of works to be monitored by the officials of
different ranks is given below:

2. The secondary monitoring and evaluation of activities implemented under the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Management and Planning Authority (CAMPA) are carried out through an independent Third-Party Agency engaged by the State CAMPA. This external agency plays a vital role in ensuring objectivity, transparency, and accountability in the assessment of CAMPA-funded works.

The Third-Party Agency is selected through a competitive process or awarded to government institutions. Once engaged, the agency undertakes a comprehensive evaluation of the implementation status, quality, and outcomes of various CAMPA activities such as plantation works, soil and moisture conservation measures, nursery development, wildlife management interventions, and infrastructure creation.

3. Implementation schedule for plantation and nurseries

The implementation schedule for plantation and nursery activities is prepared in a systematic manner to ensure timely execution of all stages of work and to achieve the desired plantation targets within the working year. The activities are planned

according to seasonal conditions and the operational calendar of the Forest Department, with the objective of maximizing seedling survival and ensuring effective field establishment.
